


Think college is out of reach? The truth is, just about everyone who wants to go to college can afford it. In fact, last year American college students received \$60 billion in grants, scholarships and low-interest loans.

Three out of four full-time undergraduate students pay less than \$10,000 for EVERYTHING – tuition, room, board, books and living expenses. A third of them pay less

than \$5,000 – and part-time students often pay even less.



At the nation's private colleges and universities, seven of ten undergraduates receive financial aid, nearly \$9,000

on average, reducing their total expenses by almost half.



Community colleges offer the least expensive college option, with an average tuition of just \$1,500 per year. They're close to where you live, and new tax

benefits can further reduce your total cost.

At public four-year colleges and universities, students pay less than \$4,000 a year for tuition, and over half
